

## Freedom of Information Request

**Request:**

TIA information for each separate trust – previously supplied as a whole

**Status:** Complete**Response Date:** 26 October 2010

In a previous enquiry information was requested for each separate Trust that had previously been identified, for the last 4 years.

Our previous correspondence was accompanied by all the generic information that we are able to supply at no cost and I can confirm that the Authority holds information falling within the description specified in your most recent request.

However in order to extract the details requested the Injury Benefits team would have to interrogate individual injury benefit files for all applications received in the last 4 years.

This would involve a manual exercise that would take many days and the cost would be well in excess of the exemption limit set out under Freedom of Information. The appropriate limit has been specified in regulations and for non-central Government departments it is set at £450. This represents the estimated cost of one person spending 2½ working days in determining whether the Authority holds the information, and locating, retrieving and extracting the information.

Under section 12 of the Freedom of Information Act the Authority is not obliged to comply with your request and I will not be processing your request further.
