

NHS Customer Board for Procurement and Supply Clinical Reference Board Meeting 15th September 2017

Category	Key updates
Strategic issues	 The DH will request a Clinical Lead from each Acute Trust to work with them on the implementation of the FOM. The Product Assurance Strategy is due to be presented to the Shadow ICC Executive Management (SHIEM) Board shortly. The three main functions of the Product Assurance Team will be: Governance of product assurance; Representation of the clinical and NHS/patient voice within the ICC and nationally; and Clinically informed innovation and policy development.
Meeting the financial challenge	The Ambulance Service Acute Sector Electrodes standardisation project is progressing well with MOU's due to be in place soon. Next steps are: (a) Standardising products across Ambulance Trusts (b) Consider roll-out across Ambulance & Acute Trusts (c) Move the pilot to Yorkshire, and other pilot areas (d) Consider other procurement & savings opportunities, e.g. focusing on fuel with Community Trusts.
Developing the procurement function	Work is progressing on the development of Educational Standards for clinical procurement practitioners which would be instrumental in protecting nurses who are involved in procurement.
Meeting the quality challenge	 A number of legal challenges have been received concerning the clinical evaluation reports which have been published so far. A standard response will be drafted to clarify the process and governance of the reports which may impact on the original timescales for the publication of future reports. More case studies have been received evidencing good practice and these will be uploaded on to the RCN website shortly.
Communications	 The importance of NHSI attendance at the regional boards was reiterated A FOM survey was issued to 194 Heads of Procurement to assess the general understanding of the model. So far, 54 responses have been received (38%). The DH will use the comments received to produce a briefing pack/executive summary which will assist anyone explaining the FOM to colleagues. It has been agreed that to widen the understanding of the work of the CET, a member of the team will attend each of the regional Customer Board meetings to provide and update. The CET and Electrodes project have been put forward for an HCSA Award
