### Keeping in touch calls

During 2017/18 we contacted all prototype practices at least once a quarter to find out how the prototyping arrangements were working. This provided valuable feedback for the programme and NHS England commissioners. Collecting knowledge and gaining understanding continues to be a focus for the programme but in the current year we will not be contacting practices in this way. However if you need information or clarification on any issue you can access the resources on the DCR website or ask the programme via the mailbox. Additionally, if practices would like to share information with the programme about their experience in the prototype arrangements then they can also contact us via the mailbox.

### Selection and training for new prototype practices

The Department of Health and Social Care has today announced that the programme will be recruiting up to an additional 50 practices into the prototype scheme. This is 30 more than originally envisaged.

All practices that expressed an interest in joining the programme have now been informed of the outcome of their application. Selected practices will be split into two cohorts going live during October 2018 and January 2019.

Practices will be supported with pre-go live training including advice on what to do in preparation for going live, together with information on prototype blend types and remuneration model.

Each new practice has been given a schedule detailing the financial elements of their contract under the prototype arrangements. A webinar will take place on Thursday 26 July and it will be repeated on Tuesday 31st to explain the basis on which the finance schedules

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have been calculated. In addition, practices will be given fact sheets to explain capitation and activity and the clinical philosophy together with a hints and tips guide to appointment book management. Training will culminate in three events across the country to provide face to face induction into the programme at the end of August/beginning of September. Existing prototype practices are invited to share any ideas and suggestions of other resources they feel would benefit practices that are new to prototyping through the DCR mailbox.

All the training materials developed will be placed on the DCR webpages and accessible to all prototype practices.
