

Setting up your NHS Volunteering account

This guide explains how to set up your NHS Volunteering account when accessing it for the first time.

Important:

- The link in your welcome email must be used within 24 hours.
- To set up your account, select the 'Create a new password' link in your welcome email.
- NHS Volunteering uses multifactor authentication to keep the service secure for users.
- We recommend that you download the Microsoft Authenticator app onto your mobile device before you start setting up your account.
- When setting up your account you will need to scan a QR code on your laptop or PC using the authenticator app.
- Please do not close your browser at any time when setting up your account.

Once your account is set up, use this link to sign in to your account: [Sign in to NHS Volunteering](#)

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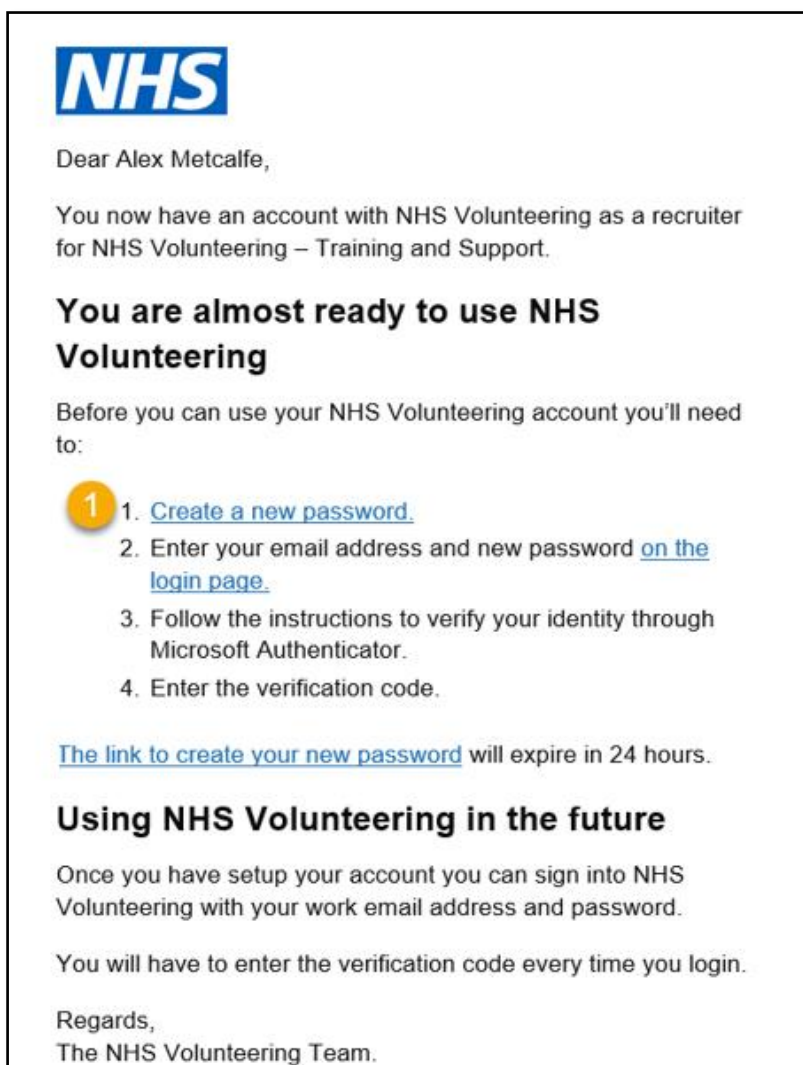
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Select the link in your welcome email on your laptop or PC

Important: You will receive this email once you have been added to the organisation account as a user.

To start setting up your NHS Volunteering account, complete the following step:

1. Select the '[Create a new password](#)' link in the welcome email to create a new password.




Tip: The link will expire after 24 hours.

Create your password on your laptop or PC

To create and confirm your password, complete the following steps:

1. Enter your password in the **New Password** text box.
2. Confirm your password in the **Confirm New Password** text box.
3. Select the [Create](#) button.

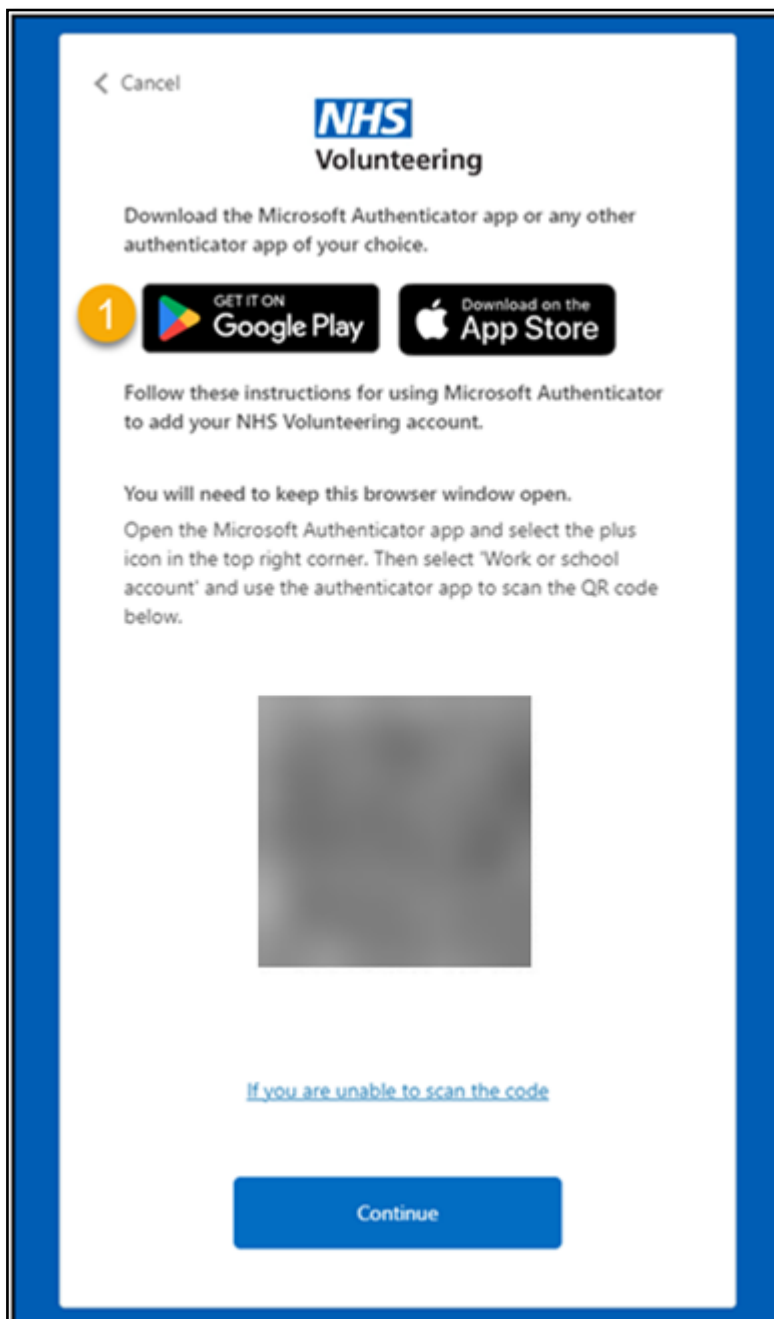

Download the Microsoft Authenticator App on to your mobile device

To download the Microsoft Authenticator app on to your mobile device, complete the following step:

1. [Download the Microsoft Authenticator app](#) for either your iOS or Android mobile device using the relevant service.



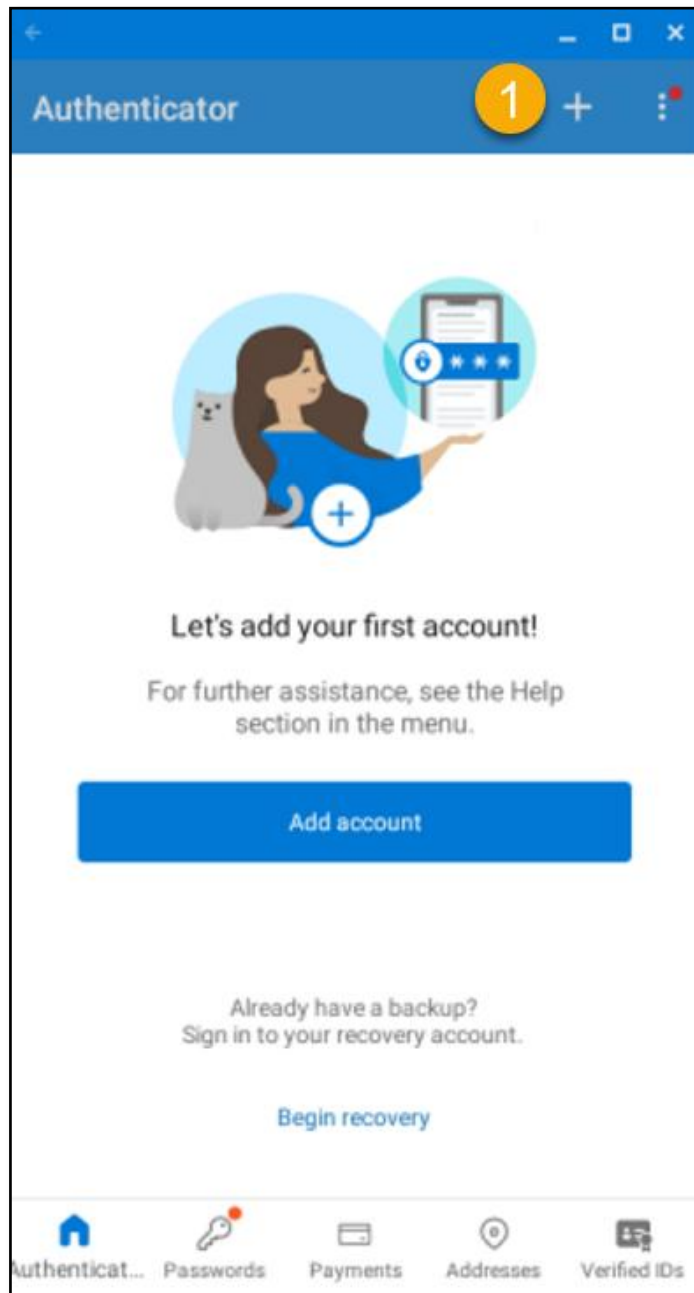
Tip: Do not close your web browser.

Add your NHS Volunteering account to the Microsoft Authenticator App on your mobile device

Important: You must have downloaded the app on to your mobile device before you can complete the next steps.

To start adding your NHS Volunteering account to the Microsoft Authenticator app, complete the following step:

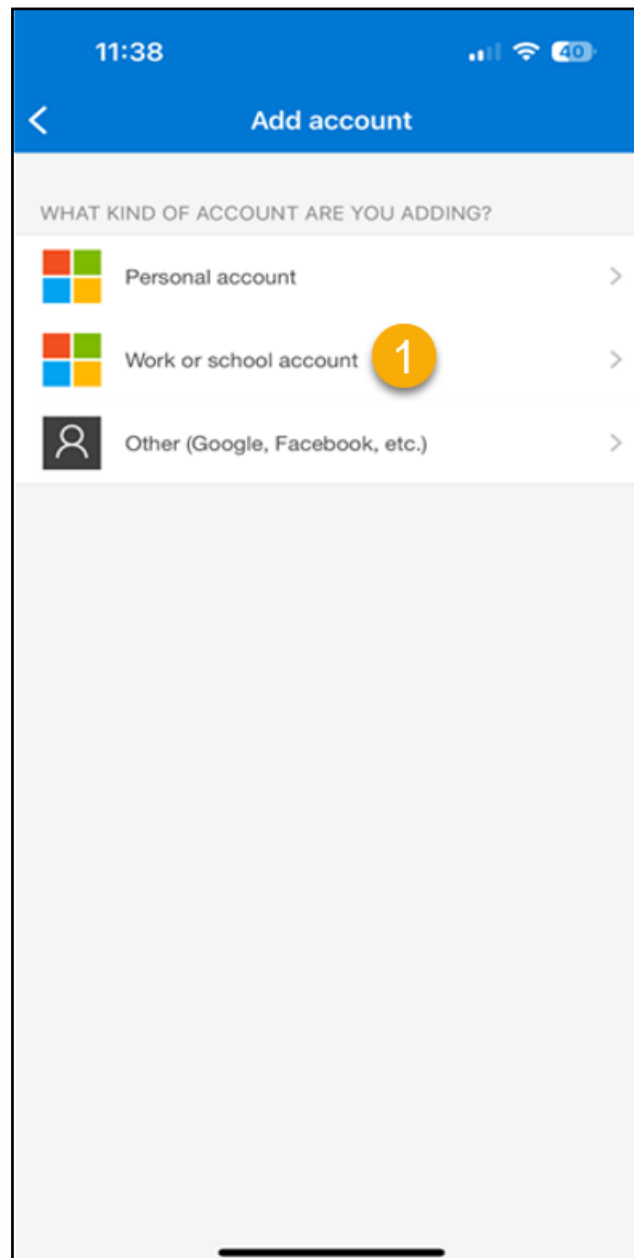
1. Open the app and press the [plus icon](#) in the top right-hand corner.



Select the type of account you want to use on the Microsoft Authenticator App on your mobile device

To select a type of account when adding your NHS Volunteering account to the Microsoft Authenticator app, complete the following step:

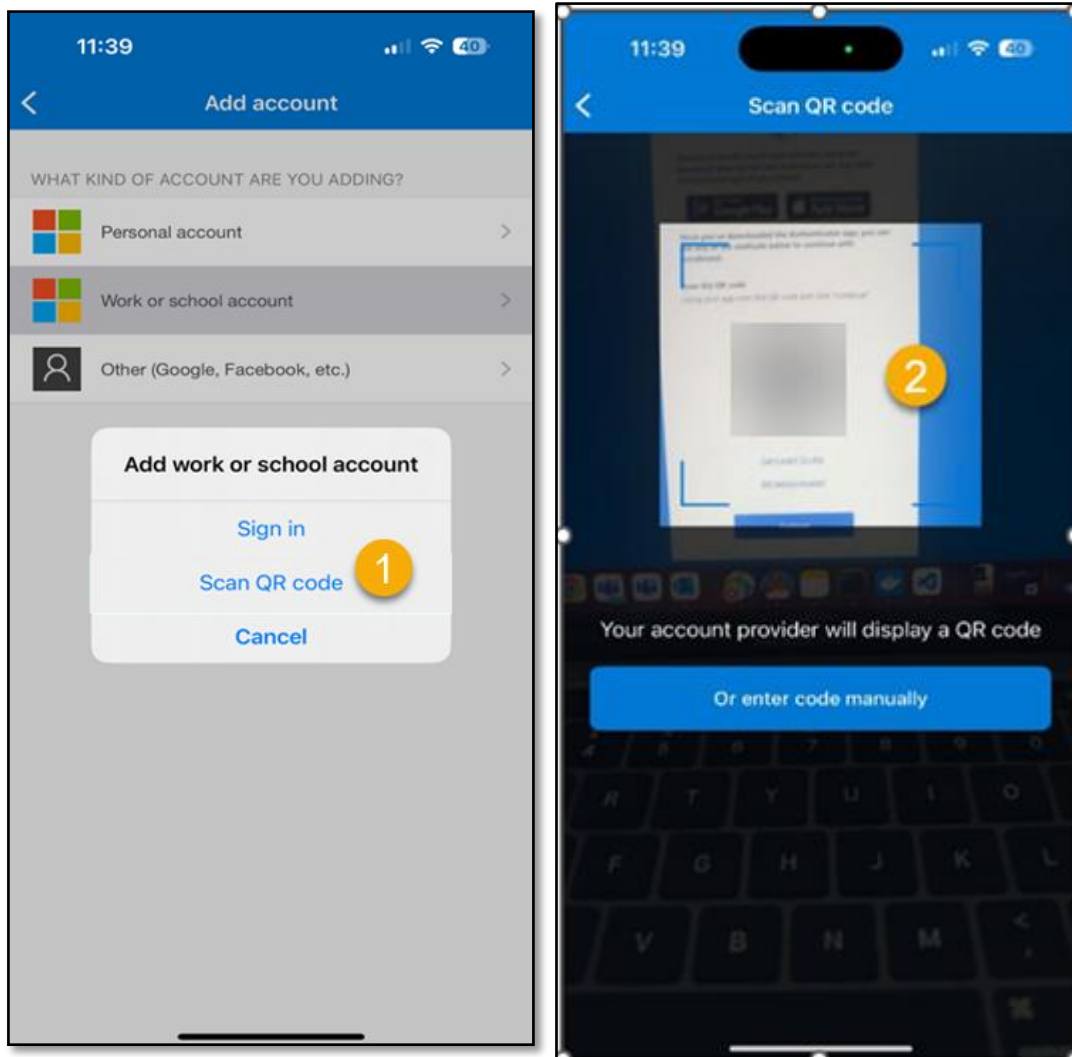
1. Select the ['Work or school account'](#) link.



Scan the QR Code on your laptop or PC using the Microsoft Authenticator app on your mobile device

To scan the QR code and link your NHS Volunteering account, complete the following steps:

1. Select the 'Scan QR code' link on your Microsoft Authenticator app.
2. [Use the camera on the app](#) to scan the QR code on your laptop or PC.



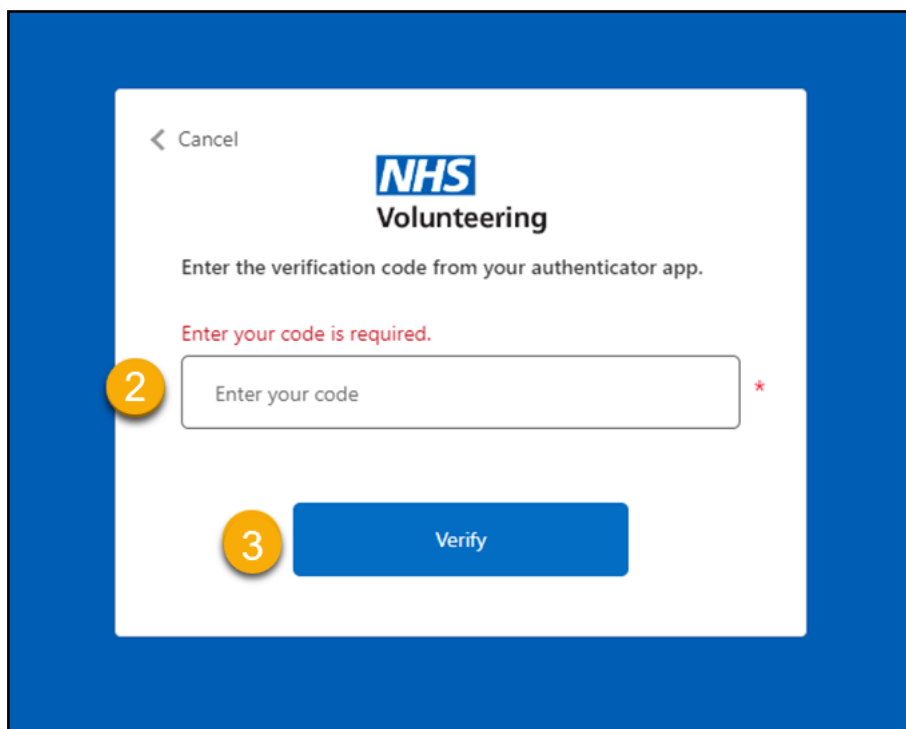
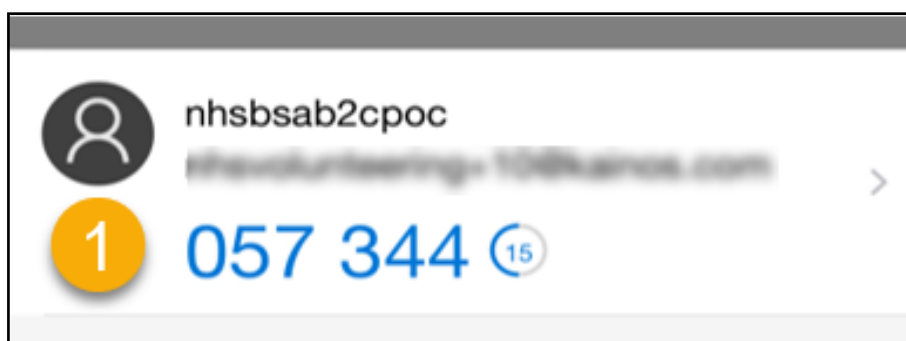
Tip: The QR code can only be scanned using the authenticator app.

Enter the verification code from the Microsoft Authenticator app into the NHS Volunteering service

Important: The Microsoft Authenticator app refreshes the 6-digit code every 30 seconds.

To add the code from the Microsoft Authenticator app to the NHS Volunteering service, complete the following steps:

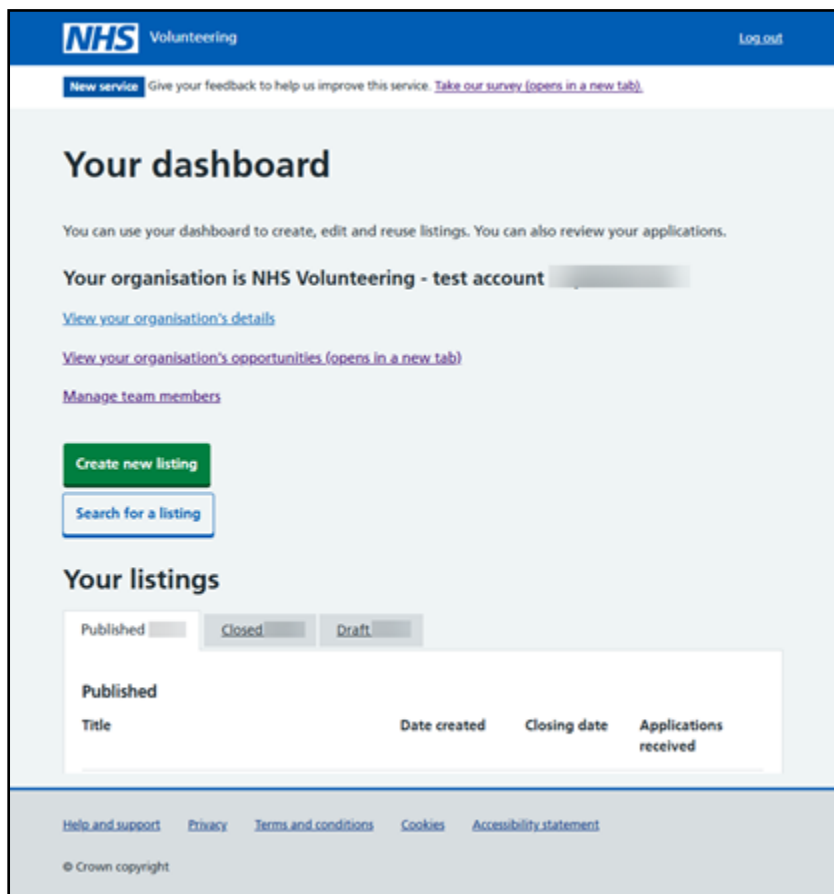
1. Read the current code on the Microsoft Authenticator app.
2. Enter the code in the **Enter your code** text box in the NHS Volunteering service.
3. Select the [Verify](#) button.
