The NHS provides all the treatment necessary to secure and maintain your oral health. There are some treatments (mainly cosmetic) that are not normally available under the NHS, and you may choose to have these provided privately. You may also choose to have some treatment provided privately as an alternative to NHS treatment. The clinician will discuss these options with you so that you can make an informed choice.

What NHS dental care means to you

Emergency arrangements

Whenever possible please contact us about urgent treatment during normal surgery hours. If you need to be seen the same day, please get in touch as early in the day as possible. If an emergency arises out of hours, you can call NHS 111. They can give you details of out-of-hours dental services in your area.

Replacements free of charge

If you have had a filling, root filling, veneer, inlay, onlay, crown or bridge provided by this dental practice under a care package on the NHS, you will not need to be charged for a replacement restoration or appliance for 24 months.

If you have had a filling provided by this dental practice under an urgent care package on the NHS, you will not need to be charged for a replacement appliance for 12 months. Urgent treatment will exclude cosmetic work.

If you require root canal treatment to a tooth restored with a filling, crown or bridge, your dentist can provide the necessary care under the usual treatment package. The standard package fees will apply.

If your tooth is damaged because of an accident and needs more treatment, your dentist can provide the right care under the usual treatment package.

If you require a crown for a tooth that was previously restored with a filling your dentist can provide the right treatment under the usual care package.

In case of a problem, and your tooth needs to be taken out, or a laboratory made item needs replacing, this will be covered under the warranty. No extra treatment package is needed.

This NHS cover does not apply to any private treatment you may have.

Dental treatment charges

I want you to understand the treatment being offered and any charge which may apply. Overleaf is a treatment plan and an estimate of the cost. The treatment plan will separate your NHS care package charges, any NHS laboratory fees you will need to pay and any separate private charges.

Please ask if you do not understand this or need any further information.

Referrals

With your agreement, it may be necessary to refer you to another clinician under NHS arrangements, for part of your course of NHS dental treatment. Where this happens you will pay your patient charge based on the treatment you received at each location unless you have been referred under additional services arrangements. For further information on this please talk to the clinician who referred you.

What the NHS will provide

The NHS provides all necessary dental care and treatment. There are some treatments (mainly cosmetic) which are not available under the NHS, and you may choose to have these privately. You may also choose to have some treatment privately as an alternative to NHS treatment. If you wish to have some private treatment then I shall give you a written estimate beforehand, on this treatment plan.

Paying for NHS treatment

You must pay the statutory charge for NHS dental treatment, unless you are entitled to free or reduced cost NHS dental services. Details of what entitles you to free or reduced cost dental treatment is shown below.

THERE IS NO CHARGE:

If on the first day of treatment:

- **you are under 18 years of age**
- **you are under 18 and in full-time education**
- **you are pregnant**
- **you have had a child in the last 12 months**

If during the course of treatment you receive, or are included in an award (as a claimant, partner, or dependent person under 20) of:

- **Income Support** (Incapacity benefit and Disability Living Allowance does **NOT** count)
- **Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance** (Contribution-based does **NOT** count)
- **Income-related Employment & Support Allowance** (Contribution-related does **NOT** count)
- **Pension Credit Guarantee Credit** (Savings Credit on its own does **NOT** count)
- **Universal Credit** (there are other circumstances and conditions that you should be aware of before requesting an exemption. For these, look at the 'Other support you may be able to get' section of your statement. Please check at www.gov.wales/help-with-health-costs)

If you are named on one of the following certificates that are valid during your course of treatment:

- **HC2 Certificate**

ONLY THE BENEFITS/CERTIFICATES LISTED ABOVE ENTITLE YOU TO FREE NHS DENTAL SERVICES

THERE IS A REDUCED COST:

- If you are named on an HC3 certificate that is valid during your course of treatment

If you feel you would benefit from help with NHS charges in the future, you may wish to make an application to the NHS Low Income Scheme which provides full or partial help with costs.

Cancelling appointments

Failure to attend or repeat cancellations without good reason may result in the practice refusing to see you again. For further information discuss with your dental team.
